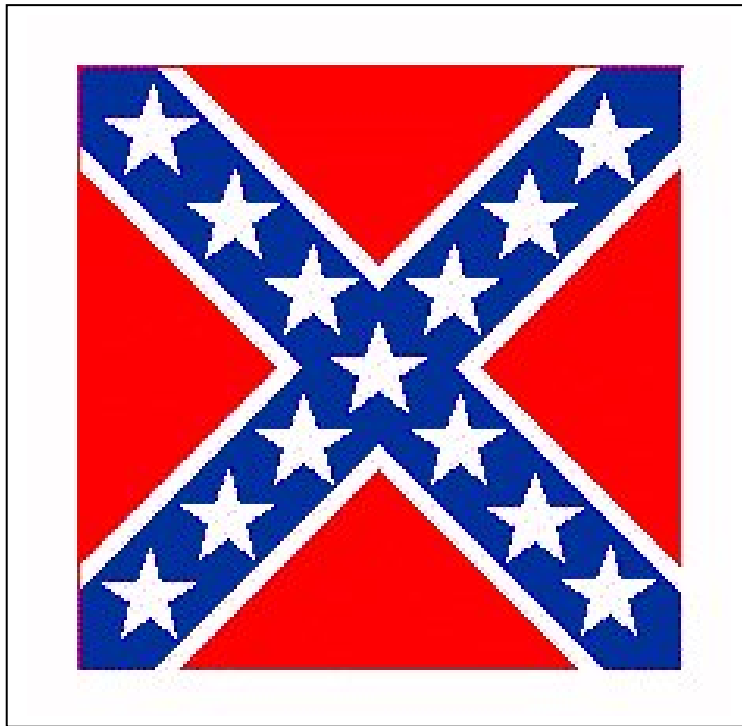

CHIC HOLLAND DECEASED

Long time Dillard-Judd member Willard Raymond Holland, better known as Chic Holland, passed away on 10 November, 2010. A portion of his obituary from the Cookeville Herald-Citizen is printed below:

He was born Oct. 29, 1915, in Robertson County to the late Gilbert Ezbon Holland and Bessie Jane Dorris Holland.

Mr. Holland was a member of the First Baptist Church of Cookeville, the Noon Rotary Club and volunteered with the Cookeville Depot Museum. He also held the distinction of being a founding member and past president of the TMEA and the TVPPA. He also served Cookeville as manager of the Cookeville Electric Department for 30 years and was the Safety Director for our city. Chic was very active in our community, serving as a volunteer with many local organizations such as the Red Cross, United Way, Boy Scouts, and many others. He especially enjoyed being named grand marshall of the 2008 Cookeville Christmas Parade.

Graveside services were held at the Elmwood Cemetery in Springfield on 13 November, 2010.

Mr. Holland's Confederate ancestor was Wesley Smith Dorris, born in Portland, TN. He joined the 30th Tennessee Infantry, was captured and later exchanged. Wesley Dorris was shot through the neck during the battle of Franklin on 30 November, 1864 and died there.
